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LETTER FROM THE LEADERSHIP

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Where the Arts Thrive for All is so much more than a tagline—it is a statement of purpose and the guiding principle by which TOArts functions. Your extraordinary support has been the driving force behind a record-breaking 2024-25 year, allowing us to expand our reach and deepen our impact throughout the community.

Thanks to your investment, our Kids and the Arts program welcomed a record-breaking 6,800 students and teachers to live performances—a 24% increase that demonstrates the growing hunger for arts experiences in our schools. Your support powered our Youth Arts Leadership Academy, where 20 young leaders created YALA Limitless Arts Workshops and produced the Revive Aid Benefit Concert, raising over \$6,200 for schools affected by the Los Angeles wildfires. This exceptional leadership will be recognized when the YALA executive team receives the Youth in Philanthropy Award from Association of Fundraising Professionals Santa Barbara Ventura County on National Philanthropy Day, November 4, 2025.

Your investment in Creators Conservatory helped propel young arts leaders toward their goals in the arts, as they embrace their studies at Moorpark College, UC Davis, and Yale. Your generosity enabled us to present 70 performances across a diverse range of genre and artists to 46,500 community members as the largest presenter at the Bank of America Performing Arts Center.

Your support also enabled compassionate individual impact—providing a violin and lessons for a teen in foster care, donating a drum set for juvenile rehabilitation programs, and partnering with the Mindful Veterans Project to offer healing arts experiences. Through groundbreaking partnerships, we brought comprehensive programming to Madroña Elementary, launched the Music Production Career Technical Education Pathway at Conejo Valley High School, and inspired nearly 1,100 students with National Geographic speakers through Trailblazers Education.

As we celebrate these achievements, we're excited to share that effective July 1, 2025, Niki Chopra Richardson assumed the role of Executive Director, bringing fresh vision to lead TOArts into its next chapter of growth and impact.

The City of Thousand Oaks continues to be an unwavering partner, and we remain grateful for their steadfast support.

Your commitment to the arts is both inspiring and transformational. It is because of your generosity that we can continue to break records, touch lives, and foster lifelong love for the arts in future generations.

ARTS ODYSSEY (SCHOOL DISTRICT PARTNERSHIPS)

Your support made possible TOArts' comprehensive Arts Odyssey programming, expanding cross-disciplinary artistic opportunities directly within local schools. Thanks to your investment, we provided 60 second-grade students at Madroña Elementary with nine significant arts activities spanning theatre, visual arts, dance, and music. Students explored creativity through a field trip to Studio Channel Islands in Camarillo, where they created original artwork, participated in gallery scavenger hunts, and observed professional artists at work. Back in the classroom, your support funded three months of guest teaching artist residencies, where students developed creativity and collaboration skills through improvisational comedy workshops.

Your generosity also enabled a groundbreaking partnership with Conejo Valley High School, where we launched their new Music Production/Sound Engineering Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathway. Thirty students participated in this pilot program made possible by your investment, working with TOArts-provided curriculum and professional guest teaching artists from the music production industry. Students gained hands-on experience at industry-standard DAW (Digital Audio Workstation) workstations, creating original podcasts, beat samples, and complete songs that serve as portfolio pieces for their future careers.

These partnerships demonstrate how your support creates lasting educational impact, bringing professional-level arts instruction directly into classrooms while preparing the next generation of creative professionals.

YOUTH ARTS LEADERSHIP ACADEMY (YALA)

TOArts' flagship workforce development program for high school students, YALA provides young arts leaders the opportunity to explore diverse career paths within the arts ecosystem while collaborating with industry professionals to conceptualize, design, and execute a capstone community event entirely of their own creation.

The 2024-25 cohort of 20 students focused their capstone project on arts education, creating YALA Limitless Arts Workshops—a comprehensive day of cross-disciplinary arts programming serving students from elementary through high school age. This ambitious undertaking culminated in a showcase performance and featured both a student art gallery and student vendor marketplace. The experience provided invaluable hands-on training as students worked directly with venue staff to produce a multi-space event utilizing the Kavli lobby, Founders Room, and outdoor courtyard areas.

Beyond their capstone project, the 2024-25 cohort demonstrated remarkable initiative and community leadership by producing the Revive Aid Benefit Concert in the Scherr Forum. This student-led fundraising event raised over \$6,200 for the performing arts departments of two SoCal schools significantly impacted by the Los Angeles wildfires. The exceptional leadership demonstrated through this initiative and other community service efforts will be recognized when the YALA executive team receives the Youth in Philanthropy Award from the AFP Santa Barbara Ventura County chapter on National Philanthropy Day, November 4, 2025.

CREATIVE ENVOYS

YALA and Conservatory students who show exceptional dedication to the programs are invited to participate in Creative Envoy as ambassadors of TOArts in the community. In the first half of 2025, Creative Envoy leaders represented TOArts as performers in February's Donor Gratitude Reception, in accepting an arts proclamation by the Mayor at the Thousand Oaks City Council meeting in April, in a focus group with Arts and Culture Manager David Yoshitomi for the County's Arts, Culture, and Creative Economy Strategic plan, as student panelists at the Greater Conejo Valley Chamber of Commerce Leadership Conejo cohort commencement, and in an artist meeting for the downtown plan with City of Thousand Oaks Deputy City Manager Akbar Alikhan.

CREATORS CONSERVATORY

TOArts Creators Conservatory focuses on the development of multi-hyphenate pre-professional artists of all creative disciplines throughout the course of the two-and-a-half week summer intensive. Highly creative and intensely collaborative, the conservatory requires students to create, produce, and perform original theatre works in mini creative teams, under the guidance of an incredible team of award-winning Broadway and industry professionals. During the 2024 conservatory, a student duo created "The Tale of Two Kevins," a short comedic original musical, which subsequently featured prominently in the student's successful artistic college application to study musical theatre composition at Yale beginning Fall 2025.


KIDS AND THE ARTS

Thanks to your generous support, Kids and the Arts provided transformative field trip experiences for local schools from PreK through 8th grade, bringing students to see live performances in the Scherr Forum and Kavli Theatres. Your investment made it possible for us to welcome a record-breaking 6,800 students and teachers to four distinct productions across more than nine performances, featuring diverse artists including the high-energy jazz ensemble Sammy Miller and the Congregation, the Indigenous folk duo Twin Flames, the dynamic theatrical troupe Kingsman Shakespeare, and the bilingual children's musical duo, 123 Andrés.

This milestone—a 24% increase over the previous year—demonstrates how your continued support amplifies our impact, ensuring that students from all backgrounds have access to live performance experiences that inspire creativity, cultural understanding, and lifelong appreciation for the arts.




ACCESSARTS

RESIDENCIES

Your support enabled us to bring world-class artist residencies directly to students, partnering with local high schools and Cal State University Channel Islands to create meaningful connections between professional artists and the next generation of performers.

Thanks to your investment, we brought two distinctive residency programs to Oxnard High School, Newbury Park High School, and Westlake High School. Sammy Miller and the Congregation delivered high-energy jazz assembly performances for entire student bodies while providing focused workshops for music students. The Alejandro Brittes Trio introduced students to traditional chamamé music through full concerts at each school, sharing the rich cultural and historical significance of this Argentinian genre.

Your generosity also made possible multiple residencies at Cal State University Channel Islands throughout the school year. The renowned Ballet Trockadero de Monte Carlo, the all-male ballet company, led an in-depth masterclass where dance students experienced professional barre work and learned excerpts from classical repertoire. CSUCI dance students then received complimentary tickets to see the company perform in the Kavli Theatre, creating a complete educational experience. Las Guaracheras captivated over 200 students—including high schoolers from the local area—in an interactive assembly, and during their masterclass, students had the extraordinary opportunity to perform alongside these celebrated musicians on stage.

COALITION FOR FAMILY HARMONY

Your support enabled TOArts to donate a drum set to the Coalition for Family Harmony's music room, directly contributing to their innovative programs that help reduce recidivism among juvenile offenders. This gift demonstrates how your investment in the arts extends beyond our stages and classrooms, supporting evidence-based interventions that use music as a powerful tool for healing and positive life transformation.

INDIVIDUAL IMPACT

Your support enabled TOArts to respond immediately when the Mark and Jacob Iskander Foundation requested a violin for a teen in foster care. Since December 2024, your investment has provided this young musician with a new instrument and ongoing weekly lessons, demonstrating how your investment in TOArts creates life-changing opportunities for individual young people, providing not just an instrument, but ongoing mentorship and the transformative power of music education.

REFRAME VENTURA COUNTY

Your support enabled TOArts to partner with the County of Ventura on the second annual ReFrame VC arts summit, bringing together over 100 artists, arts workers, and culture bearers from across East and West Ventura County. This growing collaboration was made possible through the generous sponsorship of Studio Channel Islands, Oxnard Performing Arts Center Foundation and Five07 Coffee.

Thanks to this collective investment, we facilitated a transformative daylong event featuring inspirational speakers, practical breakout sessions focused on finding success as an artist, and meaningful opportunities for participants to contribute their voices to focus groups shaping the County's ongoing Cultural Plan development. Your continued support is helping build momentum for this vital annual gathering that strengthens the arts ecosystem throughout Ventura County.

POP UP ARTS AND MUSIC FESTIVAL

SPARKING JOY! CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The 2024 – 25 year marked a pivotal milestone in TOArts' history as we celebrated both our achievements and our future with the launch of our most ambitious fundraising effort to date. On October 25th, we commemorated the 30th anniversary of the Thousand Oaks Civic Arts Plaza with CURTAIN UPI, a masquerade ball that showcased the breadth of talent TOArts nurtures—from our youngest performer at just 4 years old in a spectacular cirque performance, to accomplished alumni from our YALA and Creators Conservatory programs.

This celebration provided the perfect backdrop to unveil our \$5 million Sparking Joy! major gifts campaign, launched in February 2023 to secure TOArts' future and expand our community impact. Thanks to the visionary leadership of TOLD Foundation and the extraordinary generosity of our community, we have achieved over 60% of our campaign goal.

TOLD Foundation presented us with an unprecedented challenge: raise \$350,000 and receive a dollar-for-dollar match. The community's response was remarkable—in less than 30 minutes that evening, supporters contributed \$290,000, which TOLD Foundation immediately matched, creating a transformational \$580,000 investment in TOArts' future. By December 31st, continued community support enabled us to reach the full \$350,000 goal, securing the complete matching funds and generating \$700,000 for the campaign.




